In our modern era, most of us get up, eat breakfast, and either watch the news on television or catch the highlights on our smartphones. Then, we drive to work, listen to the AM or FM radio morning DJs, and catch the drivetime program on the way home. Finally, after a long day's work, we eat supper and relax in front of the television; it's a way of life for millions of people. However, millions of others catch alternative media outlets.

When the Internet came along, everyone became excited about the possibilities, which have proven to be incredible. The internet has allowed us to communicate with anyone worldwide with a computer, and some applications can translate languages. It has truly lived up to its name as the "information highway." With a computer ranging from a few hundred to thousands of dollars and a monthly internet subscription, you can chat with people worldwide, download files, buy things, etc.

Unlike the Internet, shortwave radio is free: no tolls, tariffs, or surcharges. Like AM and FM radio and TV broadcasting (reception via antenna), shortwave radio is free; buy a radio and catch the action!

Shortwave radio still offers a wide range of content for listeners. You can tune into international broadcasters, religious programs, amateur radio operators, and even utility stations such as maritime, aeronautical, and military communications. With shortwave radio, you can hear broadcasts from around the globe: news from Germany, folk music from Turkey, soccer from England, and politics from Korea.

You can hear real-life pirates, spies, and drug smugglers. You can eavesdrop on the people who make news: Air Force 1 and 2, the military, airlines, ships, fishermen, etc. If you feel left out from all the excitement, you can participate with either the Citizens Band or an amateur radio license.
